	• 1" margin on <u>all</u> sidestop, bottom, left, and right.
	• Justify the document left (i.e., a jagged right edge like this page); do not justify full, because the words often get spaced out in odd ways within sentences.
	• 12 pitch font only; Times New Roman.
	• Insert the number pages throughout the paper, similar to how it is done in this guideline sheet.
	• Use the labels/headers for Part 1, 2, 3 to outline your paper. You should also use the [bracketed] themes to further organize your paper. This way all of the papers will have the same template.
	• APA 6 <sup>th</sup> Edition citation for your bibliography and in-text citation.
	• You are to include <i>at least eight (8) academic scholarly sources</i> (peer- reviewed journals) and <i>at least two (2) government documents</i> in your paper that assist you in directly examining your topic. Papers without citations will be considered incomplete and not pass.
	• Spell check the document AND proof-read scrupulously for grammar errors: I will grade closely for spelling and grammar errors. I would encourage you to have a peer or an obsessive editor proofread before you turn in the final product.
	• Remember <i>I can only open ".doc" files</i> – so if you do not save it this way I cannot read your paper, thus grade your assignment.
	• It sounds funny, but put your name on the paper. You would be surprised at the number of papers that get turned in without identification.
